It is the goal of the government to enable Ireland, within EU and global frameworks, to achieve a transition to a low-carbon, climate-resilient and environmentally sustainable economy. 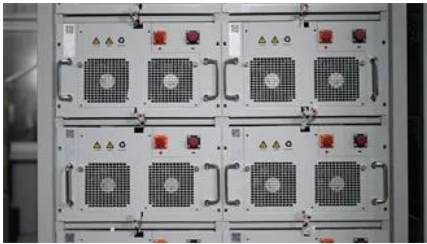
